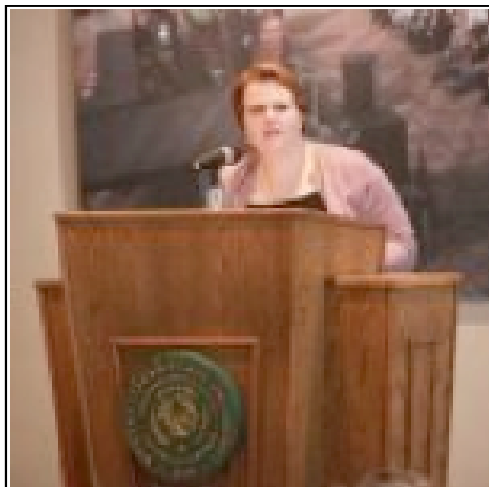

We welcome Dr. Sanford to Tulsa Branch AAUW!

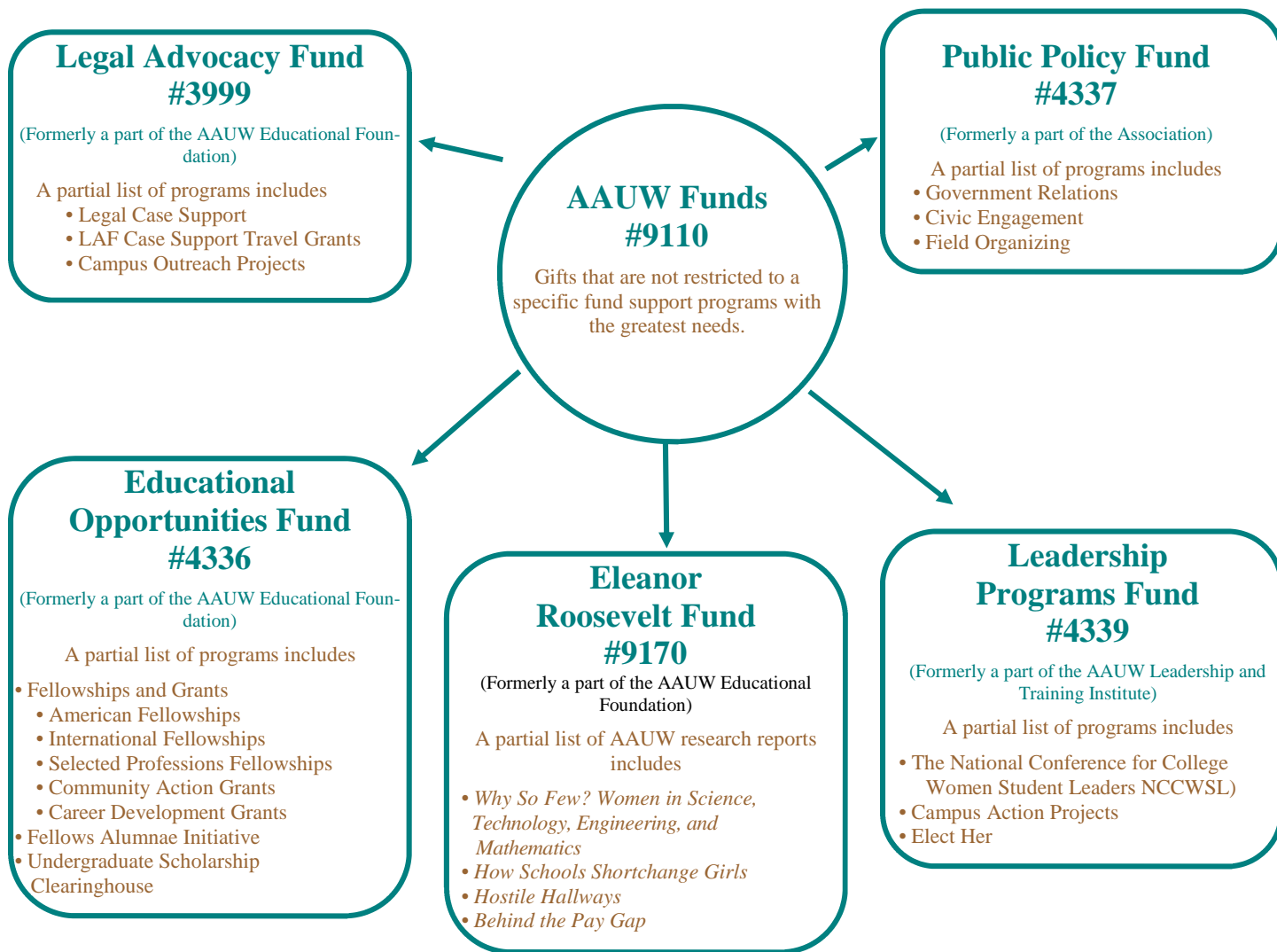

One Billion Rising National March Thursday, February 14, 2013

A huge nationwide march is planned for Feb. 14, 2013, to counteract the War on Women. Eve Ensler is founder of V-Day, the global movement to end domestic violence. That movement has launched this new campaign, "One Billion Rising", which calls on women "and the men who love them" to join together on Feb. 14, and "dance until the violence stops."

Go to the website, onebillionrising.org, and you will see events planned for this date. Videos feature the song written for this event, dancing groups, plans for events, etc.

Violence against women is a global problem, and thus the March is actually global; on the website you will see events planned in Canada, Nepal, Bangladesh, to mention a few. The nearest marches to Tulsa at this time are Parsons, KS, and Shawnee, OK.
