In Black's new position she is committed to exposing students, K-4 through 12th grade to the wonderful world of engineering. She will also be striving to gain scholarships and internships for those engineering students currently in the

pipeline at the college level. As Coordinator of TAE Xan will coordinate collaboration by Tulsa Community College, OUTulsa, OSU-Tulsa, ORU, University of Tulsa, and Tulsa Tech to grow and keep engineers in Tulsa.

AAUW releases new research report November 15 AAUW will live-stream the launch of our new research—<u>Graduating to a Pay Gap</u>: *The Earnings of Women and Men One Year after College Graduation*. The report also examines one immediate effect of the pay gap for many women — high student loan debt burden. This report follows up on the 2007 AAUW report, <u>Behind the Pay Gap</u>, which found that just one year after college graduation women are paid only 80 cents for every dollar men are paid.

Lilly Ledbetter to appear on *Colbert Report* Fair pay advocate and AAUW friend Lilly Ledbetter will appear on the *Colbert Report* on October 21.

California lawsuit against Wal-Mart moves forward A federal court denied Wal-Mart's motion to dismiss and gave 90,000 plaintiffs in the California-based lawsuit <u>Dukes v. Wal-Mart</u> the go-ahead to proceed with their gender discrimination class-action suit. AAUW has provided case support to the plaintiffs since January 2011.

AAUW nets Nonprofits Award GreatNonprofits has named AAUW a 2012 Top-Rated Nonprofit.
