

### Make your voice heard at Senate education hearing!

The Senate Education committee is currently holding hearings on updating our nation's education policy.

Contact your senators today and urge them to support an education bill that:

- ◆ Spends public funds on public education only—not private school vouchers or "portability" schemes that would pave the way for vouchers in the future;
- Hold schools accountable for demonstrating that they are meeting educational goals;
- Requires annual, statewide assessments that measure each student's progress toward meeting the state's college and career-ready standards;
- ◆ Requires schools to collect and break down data on students' performance by subgroups so they can identify and close achievement gaps; and
- ◆ Reauthorizes and fully funds the Women's Educational Equity Act to provide resources to fully implement Title IX.
