# **AAUW MISSION, ACTION, NOTES**

### **GROUNDBREAKING RESEARCH**

AAUW's newest research report, *Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in Leadership*, explores the obstacles that hold women back from reaching their full leadership potential.

Despite making up approximately 50 percent of the U.S. workforce, women are shockingly outnumbered in leadership positions in the education, corporate, and political sectors. This report provides practical recommendations for moving more women up into seats of power.

### **NO! on DC PRIVATE SCHOOL VOUCHER BILL**

The House is trying again to reauthorize the District of Columbia private school voucher program. AAUW opposes HR 4901. Public funds should only be used for public education — not private or religious school voucher schemes that benefit only a few. Urge your member of Congress to vote "no" on HR 4901 and any other private voucher programs!

# INTERSECTIONALITY? WHAT IS IT? WHY DO WE NEED IT?

Intersectionality is a fairly new term to most of us. The term acknowledges the multiple overlapping or intersecting, of social identities and related systems of oppression.

As feminists, we must recognize how an issue affects women differently, based on their various identities. AAUW needs to act in all women's interests. For example, when encouraging girls toward STEM fields, we need to recognize that girls of color may have additional hurdles to cross. Police accountability, equal pay, reproductive rights, and

many other issues affect women variously according to their social identities.

The Younger Women's Task Force, powered by AAUW, is especially working in this area. Let's keep our eyes and minds open to help bring equality for all women.

### LEADERSHIP AND WAGES ARE INTERTWINED

The gender wage gap is influenced by many factors, but one important contributor is the gender leadership gap.

A recent study of young working women found that many who leave their current jobs do so to seek out higher pay and better opportunities to develop skills, suggesting that low pay and limited opportunities for advancement go hand in hand.

When women are kept out of leadership positions, they earn less, and consequently are more likely to leave the workforce entirely.

# DO OKLA. STATE OFFICIALS CARE ABOUT OUR EQUAL PAY?

In 2016, of the 42 governors who gave State of the State speeches or wrote addresses, only two discussed equal pay. No, Oklahoma was not one of the two.

But state legislators are paying more attention to this issue. A bill addressing equal pay has been introduced in the Oklahoma legislature, and has passed at least one House. So far 34 states have introduced equal pay bills.

We need to encourage our state legislatures to continue this effort and push through to the Governor's signature!

### **Notes from the State Convention**

**Rose Unterschuetz** will serve in the appointed position of College/University Partners for 2016-2018.

We are proud of members from Tulsa who served in the 2014-2016 term: **Linda Brooks** (Recording Secretary), **Rose Unterschuetz** (College/University Partnership), and **Eva Pope-Garrett** (Diversity Chair).

The proposition **to increase state dues to \$10** (from \$7) passed in the vote by state membership. The total of dues for full membership in branch (\$14), state (\$10) and national (\$49) **will now be \$73.00**.
