	015 AAUW National Convention in San Diego, June 18-21, decision of the second s								

At our 2015 AAUW National Convention in San Diego, June 18-21, decisions will be made on changes in our policies and bylaws; officers will be elected. Voting on all of these actually began April 15 online; members requesting paper ballots have until May 26 to post-mark their mailed ballots. [Deadline to request a paper ballot is May 8.] Online voting ends at 9 p.m., June 19, 2015.

Our Spring-Summer 2015 <u>Outlook</u> lists the slate of candidates with their bios, information on the voting process, and on proposed public policy changes, and bylaws changes. We will be voting for AAUW President, Vice President, and ten Director positions on the national board.



One of the bylaws changes that has peaked a lot of interest and some controversy is to eliminate the degree requirement for membership in AAUW.

We will be casting our votes at our meeting, via laptop computers. In order to vote you will need two numbers: (1) your MEMBER ID, and (2) your VOTER PIN. Both of these numbers are printed on the cover of your <u>Outlook</u>, the Spring-Summer 2015 issue.

If you have already voted, good for you! You can help others with the voting process!

We will also be electing our branch officers for 2015-2017.

Following our meeting we will go to Zio's in the Plaza Shopping Center at 81st and So. Lewis for lunch.

Tech Trek TU 2015 Update June 14-21, 2015

Classes, Activities set

A wide variety of activities has been set for the 36 Tech Trek campers. After check-in and parent orientation on Sunday, the girls will enjoy a dinner. Camp meeting follows, and ice breaker games.

Each morning campers will attend Core Classes of science, technology, engineering and math. On Monday they will participate in a Ropes' Course. After dinner each day the girls have the opportunity to call home, and before they retire, they will spend an hour on journaling.

Tuesday includes sessions on fMRI (functional Magnetic Resonance Imaging), hexaflexagons, and forensic science.

Wednesday there are tentative plans to go to a glass blowing class at the Woody Guthrie Center. In the evening the girls will have professional etiquette prep for the meeting on Thursday with professional women in STEM.

Thursday the campers will have a workshop with Christi Luks, Professor at the Missouri University of Science & Technology. Luks has a PhD in Chemical Engineering from TU.

Friday the girls go on a field trip to the Aquarium which includes dinner. Saturday after some presen-

tations, the campers depart. **Hopefully, we will** have 36 more women entering the STEM fields at some point in the future!


