## **ERA** in the News

Things are staying busy for the Equal Rights Amendment, at both the federal and state level.

At the federal level Sen. Ben Cardin, lead cosponsor of SJ Res 1, spoke on the Senate floor in strong support of women's rights and the Equal Rights Amendment.

In the state of North Dakota efforts continue to rescind the state's ratification of the federal ERA. To date, there is not legal precedent for a state to legally rescind ratification of any amendment.

This week the Nevada State Senate passed legislation to send a state Equal Rights Amendment to the Nevada voters, potentially in 2022.

HJ Res 17, removing the time limit to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, has already passed the House with bipartisan support.



April 7—May 17 AAUW members will be voting on amendments to our Public Policy Priorities and bylaws. Special attention is being paid to the proposal to eliminate AAUW's longstanding degree requirement in order to become a member of AAUW.

Here are the answers to some questions you may have. You can also go to www.aauw.org, search for the "aauw election" page for more information.

#### When and how do I vote?

All voting will take place online April 7 to May 17, 2021, unless you send a request to AAUW for a paper ballot. All members without an email address on file with AAUW national will receive notification of the vote by mail.

## What constituters a quorum for a vote to be valid?

AAUW bylaws require that submitted ballots equal in number to at least five percent of the votes entitled to be cast by members is the quorum.

# How many votes are needed for the changes to be passed?

AAUW bylaws require that the "yes" vote of twothirds of the votes cast is required to amend the bylaws. Public Policy Priorities can be amended with a "yes" vote of a majority of the votes cast.

# If the votes pass, when would the changes be in effect?

Changes to the bylaws would be effective immediately. AAUW's national staff will be prepared to change membership language, the join function, and other related items as necessary immediately after the vote.

# How will Student Associates be handled if the degree requirement is eliminated?

The Student Associates category would be eliminated. However, the Board does have the ability to set a separate dues rate for students and is planning to make a decision on keeping the current rate, or to make all student dues \$0.00 this spring.

# Is Life Membership affected by the proposed bylaws change?

There are no changes to Life membership.
