CONGRATULATIONS to University of California at Irvine Ph.D. candidate **Zayda Siorrell-Medina**, recipient of a \$20,000 AAUW fellowship! Her research seeks to measure the impact of the U.S. immigrant-serving nonprofit sector.

MORE CONGRATULATIONS are due to **Dr. Ngozi Oknojo-Iweala**, Director-General of the World Trade Organization, on being awarded the 2021 AAUW Alumnae Recognition Award.

Dr. Okonjo-lweala is a global finance expert,

economist and international development professional with over 30 years of experience working in Asia, Africa, Europe, Latin America and North America. A 1977-78 AAUW International Fellow, she received her Ph.D. in regional economics and development from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.



She has served twice as Nigeria's Finance Minister and shortly as Foreign Minister in 2006, the first woman to hold both positions. Currently, she is the first African and first woman to be the Director-General of the WTO. In 2021 Dr. Okonjolweala was named one of *Time* magazine's 100 Most Influential People.

honors a past recipient of an AAUW fellowship or grant who has attained outstanding success and distinction in their chosen profession. Through this award, which was established in 2013, AAUW also recognizes the accomplishments of alumnae who inspire women and girls and advance our mission of achieving gender equity.
