
downward turn per news reports.

Emily Contois, author and Assistant Professor of Media Studies at The University of Tulsa, will be our guest speaker at our March 12th meeting.



So what is the current status of the ERA?


If you're a woman in America — or you identify as anything other than a cisgender male — you might be inclined to believe you're entitled to equal rights as men, if not equal privileges. After all, the 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution promises all citizens "equal protection of the laws".

An interesting article in the **Bazaar** lays it out for us.

Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, a supporter of the ERA, in February 2020, said "Every constitution in the world written since the year 1950 . . . has the equivalent of an Equal Rights Amendment, and we don't."

## Oklahoma Women's Coalition calls us to action!

The Oklahoma Legislative session has begun, and the Oklahoma Women's Coalition (OWC) is alerting us.

HB 1775 is up for passage. This found at: bill severely restricts public school teachers and students from learning and talking about race, gender, and sexuality in the classroom. All young people deserve to learn an

inclusive and accurate history in schools, free from censorship or discrimination.

The OWC joined the ERA Coalition on an amicus brief to the Supreme Court of the United States. The brief is part of a broad litigation strategy aimed towards ratifying the ERA.
