AAUW plays well with others.....

- As a member of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) Coalition, AAUW continues to push for a Senate vote on S.J. Res. 1/H.J. Res. 17, which would remove the deadline to ratify the ERA. Join us in urging your senators and Senate majority leader Chuck Schumer to call for a vote to pass the ERA and support equality for all!
- AAUW joined 35 advocacy organizations in endorsing a letter led by a group of nearly 100 senators urging U.S. Department of Education Secretary Cardona to extend the Public Service Loan Forgiveness waiver which is currently set to expire today, October 31!
- AAUW joined over 400 organizations in supporting the Respect for Marriage Act (H.R. 8404), which would protect marriages of samesex and interracial couples and ensure that federal benefits are available to all married couples, no matter where they live.
- Since 1978 the Pregnancy Discrimination Act has been best defense for pregnant people who face discrimination on the job. But many people who are pregnant still risk being forced out of the workplace simply for following doctors' orders. The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act would close the loopholes in the original act and provide much-needed clarity to employers and workers to ensure workplace safety for all.

"I was so inspired by my recent conversation with Dr. Keisha N. Blain, AAUW 2016-17 American Fellow and award-winning historian, professor and author. She shared her insight on her most recent book, Until I am Free: Fannie Lou Hamer's Enduring Message to America. Look for the recording to be posted soon on our website.

"Hamer was an outspoken activist in the 1960s for civil rights and voting rights — issues that remain startlingly relevant. As midterm elections loom, I'm trying to remain optimistic that the results will elevate the equity priorities AAUW fights for every day. For that to happen, women must not only turn out to the polls; they must take the time to fully understand the issues.

"Because, with so much at stake — whether it's reproductive rights, student loan debt or workplace discrimination — it's not an exaggeration to say our very lives may depend on the outcome.

"The good news is we have the power to drive change. Women vote in greater numbers than men and determine the outcomes in race after race.

Help Keep Title IX Strong

DID YOU KNOW that AAUW laid the foundation for Title IX?

By 1945 AAUW mobilized to open doors for women in education. Following World War II, the GI Bill helped men pursue higher education, while many women were left behind.

OVER THE following decades, we compiled mountains of research documenting discrimination in education and distributed guidelines for presidents of four-year institutions.

TITLE IX passed in 1972; this is the 50th anniversary!

By 1975, AAUW established a coalition of organizations providing Title IX guidance to the U.S. Department of Education that still stands strong today.

By 2020, we fought back after Education Secretary Betsy DeVos weakened protections against sexual harassment in schools.

Now, IN 2022, we anticipate a reversal of the harmful rollbacks from the prior administration. And we're urging President Biden to go even further in ensuring all students can participate equally in school sports.

Clash on School Issues


On Tuesday, Oct. 25, the candidates for State Superintendent of Public Instruction faced off in their only debate and shared drastically different plans for education.

Highlights: Secretary of Education Ryan Walters focused on giving parents and kids choice, "left-wing" indoctrination", and casting blame for educational issues on Joe Biden, Joy Hofmeister, his opponent Jena Nelson and the teachers' unions.

Nelson focused on public school funding, providing multi-level support for students and the threats to teachers across the state.

When asked whether the candidates support school vouchers: Walters said, "Absolutely. I support parents and I support kids so of course I will." Nelson stated, "I do not support school vouchers. Vouchers are a way to defund public education and they are a rural school killer."

When asked where they stand on book bans in school libraries: Nelson highlighted the importance of having developmentally appropriate books in libraries and the current processes within school districts of reporting books that parents deem inappropriate. She said we also have to use some common sense.



Walters reiterated his belief that pornography should not be in our schools and erroneously accused Nelson of promoting books such as certain graphic novels which he believes to be pornographic and inappropriate for minors
