News 'n Notes from National AAUW

Marching for Equality, Fighting for Change



This is a photo of our AAUW Lobby Corps as they went to Capitol Hill on July 27 to meet with lawmakers and urge them to affirm the Equal Rights Amendment.

THE CORPS is planning more visits this year to advocate for the passage of AAUW's policy priorities, including the *Paycheck Fairness Act*.

ALSO, JULY 27 was Black Women's Equal Pay Day, which calls attention to how Black women working full-time, year-round, are paid only 67 cents for every dollar paid to non-Hispanic white men.

ON AUGUST 15, AAUW marked *Mom's Equal Pay Day*. What a shame we still need to mark these days!

ON AUGUST 26 AAUW was proud to be a partner with the *March on Washington*, continuing the original 1963 March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom.

WOMEN'S EQUALITY DAY was August 26, which commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment in 1920, which gave women the right to vote — in theory. Of course, many women, particularly women of color, continued to be shut out of the voting booth for decades. One hundred and three years later, we are *still* fighting for equal voting rights, as disenfranchisement efforts have picked up steam across the country.

PLEASE DO YOUR PART BY URGING CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT!

Help to strengthen Title IX

MORE THAN 50 YEARS have elapsed since the passage of Title IX, which protected generations of women against sex-based discrimination in education.

BUT THE PAST FIVE YEARS have underscored that "settled" law is anything but. In 2020, the Trump Administration eviscerated Title IX's safeguards against campus sexual assault and harassment — a huge step backwards.

THE GOOD NEWS IS, together, we're undoing that change and further expanding Title IX"s reach. The Biden administration is expected to finalize rules that will restore protections for students experiencing sexual harassment, clarify protections for LGBTQ+ students, and strengthen support for pregnant and parenting students.

AAUW HAS BEEN INVOLVED BY

- providing strong, specific public comment
- rallying activists, AAUW members, to be among the voices demanding change
- joining coalition efforts to push back on legislative efforts to exclude transgender women and girls in school sports.

THERE IS STILL WORK TO BE DONE ...

including pushing Congress to pass the longoverdue Gender Equity in Education Act (GEEA), which includes provisions for more resources, training and technical assistance to support Title IX's full implementation.
