AAUW Life Membership for Dr. Brooks

Dr. Beatrice Brooks was celebrated in April, 1974, with a National AAUW Life Membership for her 50 years of service in AAUW. Born and brought up in Boston, Mass., Beatrice Brooks graduated from the Girls Latin School and from Mt. Holyoke College, earning her doctorate from Bryn Mawr College.

She taught religion at Miami University in Ohio, at Cottey College in Missouri, and at Wellesley College, joining AAUW in Boston in 1924. In Oxford, Ohio, she served two separate terms as president. When she moved to Santa Fe in 1965 she continued in the work of AAUW.

Tulsa Branch AAUW appreciates Dr. Brooks' service, and we thank her grandson, Charles Brooks, for memorializing her with his gift for our Chili-Bingo Fundraiser.
